Schaefer's expectation was to be a valued component of an inspired, like-minded group of professionals, however his early career turned out to be a lesson in the stress-filled pecking order with a disproportionate amount of time being spent covering up weaknesses, manipulating information and pointing fingers. *Sound familiar?*

He set out to do something about the frustration and anxiety that he witnessed in the workplace which often led to unique survival habits among his coworkers. Those personal experiences along with wit and a passion for helping people is what Schaefer brings with him every time he talks to clients about getting the most out of the employment experience. In 1989 he formed his own recognition awards company then a few years later, after finding his old notes, penned ***The Vocational Shrink—An Analysis of the Ten Levels of Workplace Disillusionment***. Though written as a humorous view of workplace craziness, it actually takes a serious look at the problems of low employee morale and high turnover which still plague so many companies today. Many of the causes and some of the solutions for these destructive job-in-spired behaviors are presented in his book and accompanying game.

After more than 20 years of working with major corporations, Schaefer knows what makes employees tick. His manager training program “*Why Should Supervisors Care? Getting to the bottom of what they're really thinking—“What's in it For Me?”*” shows how subtle changes in the way they communicate can help managers and their employees greatly improve their work life. “I'm convinced that everyone has the capacity to become far more effective and fulfilled than they think they can be,” shares Schaefer. All of the resources required are freely available, if they simply choose to use them enthusiastically and in the right sequence.

Today John Schaefer and his team at Schaefer Recognition Group help companies realize and react to what he calls the Employer/Employee Disconnect. He's sought out for his straight talk, loved for his humor and dedicated to helping people have more fun, be more productive and save their companies tons of money.
